
While only some of the CUCS permanent supportive housing sites have art therapy programs, each artist is supported to explore their creativity.




- CUCS led the outreach efforts to help move 1,511 people off the streets in 2022
- Last year, Janian Medical Care provided primary medical and psychiatry care in 20,785 appointments. Janian Medical Care practitioners provide psychiatric care services at 65 community-based sites across New York City
- 2,605 vulnerable New Yorkers are served by CUCS and Janian in permanent supportive housing programs
- CUCS Connects helped 5,983 people apply for and enroll in benefits programs in 2022
- 16,758 human services, behavioral health, and justice system professionals received training last year
